Privacy Notice

How we use your personal information

This notice explains how we use and protect the information obtained from visiting this website. The purpose of this notice is to make you aware of how we will handle your information.

Who are we?

Dumfries and Galloway Housing Partnership Ltd, a registered Scottish charity (Charity Number SC039896), a Registered Social Landlord, a Company incorporated in Scotland under the Companies Acts as a company limited by guarantee (Registered Number SC220297) and having its Registered Office at Grierson House, The Crichton, Bankend Road, Dumfries DG1 4ZS (“we” or “us”) take the issue of security and data protection very seriously and strictly adhere to guidelines published in the Data Protection Act 1998 and the General Data Protection Regulation (EU) 2016/679, which is applicable from the 25th May 2018, together with any domestic laws subsequently enacted.

We are notified as a Data Controller with the Office of the Information Commissioner under registration number **Z7078924** and we are the data controller of any personal data that you provide to us.

How we collect information from you and what information we collect

We collect information about you:

- for registration to certain areas of the website, including the self –service portal;
- to allow you to use services on our website;
- to allow you to request a service, including a repair;
- to allow you to be referred for welfare benefit advice;
- to allow you to get involved with our company;
- to enable online payments to be made;
- to allow you to make a complaint;
- to allow us to consider your comments, queries and suggestions and respond if necessary;
- to allow us to respond to your enquiries for information/further information.

The type of personal information collected on our website may include your name, date of birth, company name, address (including postcode), email address, telephone number, username and password, unique reference numbers, IP address and debit/credit card details.

If you are directed to our online payment web page, some contact details and card details will be collected to enable your payment to be made. These will be obtained using a secure third-party provider, Allpay.

IP addresses and cookies

We may collect information about your computer, including where available your IP address, operating system and browser type, for system and business administration and for usage monitoring. This is statistical data about our users' browsing actions and patterns and does not identify any individual.

Cookies are small text files that are placed on your computer by websites that you visit. They are widely used in order to make websites work, or work more efficiently, as well as to provide information to the owners of the site.

The information below explains the cookies we use and why

Our site has three Google Analytics cookies as follows:

- ga expires after 2 years
- gid- expires after 1 day

- Gat – expires immediately

These cookies are used to collect information about how visitors use our site. We use the information to compile reports and to help us improve the site. The cookies collect information in an anonymous form, including the number of visitors to the site, where visitors have come to the site from and the pages they visited.

We need your information and will use your information:

Sharing of Your Information

The information you provide to us will be treated by us as confidential and will be processed only by our employees within the UK/EEA. The information you provide to us will be held on our computer and paper records in the UK.

The information may be accessed by or given to our staff, our contractors and our agents who act for us, for the purposes set out in this notice.

We use Cognito LLC, who provide the online platform through which you can complete our website forms online and they store the completed form on DGHP's behalf. Cognito Forms LLC is based in the United States, which does not offer the same standard of data protection as the UK. However, Cognito Forms LLC participates in and has certified its compliance with the EU-US Privacy Shield Framework, as part of which Cognito LLC has agreed to comply with data protection standards similar to those available in the UK when it holds and uses your personal information. Your Rights
